1. The day of surgery

- a. 2-3 hours after you arrive home use your OFLOXACIN, KETOROLAC and PREDNISOLONE ACETATE eye drops.
- **b.** Use all 3 drops again at dinner & bedtime.
- **c.** Do not press or rub the eye.
- **d.** Sleep with the shield tonight.

2. Normal postoperative complaints

- **a.** Your eye may be red.
- **b.** Your vision may be blurred.
- **c.** Your pupil may be large and dilated.
- **d.** Your eye may feel scratchy, teary, and light sensitive.
- **e.** You may see floaters or black spots.

3. The day after the surgery

- **a.** You do not need to wear the shield any more.
- **b.** You can resume normal activities.
- **c.** Bending and lifting are OK as long as there is no discomfort.
- **d.** Showering or bathing are OK but avoid getting water in your eye.
- **e.** Do not wear makeup for 1 week.

4. Postoperative eye drops

- **a. OFLOXACIN** 1 DROP 3 X A DAY for 10 days.
- **b. KETOROLAC** 3 X A DAY until the bottle is finished.
- **c. PREDNISOLONE ACETATE (Shake well)** 1 DROP 3 X A DAY for 1 month.
- **d.** Wait a few minutes between each drop.(You may finish one bottle before another, this is OK.)

5. Please call the office immediately if there is a serious **problem.** Increased redness, pain, swelling, or worsening blurred vision requires an immediate phone call or attention.
